Minute Number 3039/16/A – Public Speaking

The Member of the Public present at the meeting raised the following matter:

- He asked if Item 9. The Facebook Page had an actual address. A Councillor replied that it was Findern Community Page, which was a closed group but they would accept requests. It was explained that the group was not run or anything to do with Findern Parish Council.

The Clerk reported that the Lease Agreement would be signed during December and all the Utilities in the name of the Parish Council had been cancelled and reset up in the new name.

The Chair reported that the Parish Council Meetings from December would be held back at the Findern Parish Rooms and the Parish Council would hold their fuddle there after the meeting. The Chair said that she would spend her Chairs Allowance on food and refreshments for this event. Resolved: Findern Parish Council agreed to hold the Annual fuddle after the December 2016 Parish Council Meeting and agreed for the Chair to use her allowance for the food and refreshments.

1. Minute Number 3046/16 - To receive apologies for absence

There were no Apologies for Absence.

2. Minute Number 3047/16 - Variation of the Order of Business

There were no Variations to the Order of Business.

3. Minute Number 3048/16 - Declaration of Members Interests.

Resolved: Cllr Smith Declared a Pecuniary Interest in item 6. Findern Parish Room Management

4. Minute Number 3048/16 - Public Speaking – (10 Minutes)

Minute Number 3048/16/A – Public Speaking

Members of the Public raised the following matters:

- Clarification was required from the October 2016 Parish Council Meeting in relation to land on Porters Lane. The Member of the Public asked why this was not on the Parish Council agenda for discussion as asked for at the previous meeting. The Chair replied that it is not on the agenda as it is not a Parish Council Matter as it was a civil matter. The Clerk reported that she had spoken to DALC in relation to this matter as agreed at the previous meeting and the information received was as reported at the last Parish Council Meeting. This matter is not a Findern Parish Council matter as Findern Parish Council does not own, lease or maintain the land in question. The land is privately owned, therefore it would be unlawful and improper for Findern Parish Council to interfere in this matter in any way, especially as it is currently following a due legal process. This matter is not within Findern Parish Councils responsibility or jurisdiction. The Clerk replied that the only thing that she could suggest was that residents try to contact the actual owner. Cllr Ford reported that he had spoken to Gaynor Richards the Planning Enforcement Officer at SDDC but unless the occupiers break any legislation for example littering or fly tipping there is nothing further that SDDC can do but they will keep an eye on the area. Cllr Ford explained that a horse box and vehicles could not be classed as tipping. Cllr Ford explained that Gaynor Richards had spoken to somebody acting for the owners and they were getting ready to sell the land. The Chair asked the residents in attendance to not misunderstand the Parish Council as the Parish Council had a lot of

compassion for the problems that they were suffering, but this situation was out of our control the Parish Council's hands were tied on this matter. Cllr Ford said that he would speak to Chris Smith at SDDC to see if there was anything that he could do or advise. Cllr Ford asked the residents concerned to keep a diary of any issues, problems or anti-social behaviour that they encountered, so that a case could be built up if required.

- A resident reported that they had been told that the cemetery would be extended and the drainage problems would be resolved.
- A resident said that it was good to hear that the local Marina was being extended again. The Parish Council were asked about the street lighting towards the Marina that was non-existent and very dark. The Clerk explained that contact had been made in the past with DCC on this matter but they had no plans to install extra lighting, especially as lighting was being switched off in other area around the district. Cllr Ford said that he would take this matter back to DCC.

Minute Number 3048/16/B – Police Representatives Report

There were no Police present at the meeting and there was nothing to report.

Minute Number 3048/16/C – District Council Representatives Report

Apologies were received from Cllr McPherson.

Cllr Ford was present at the meeting.

Minute Number 3048/16D – County Council Representatives Report

Cllr Ford was present at the meeting and gave his report as follows:

- He reported on fly tipping and people leaving fridges, washing machines etc outside their properties. He explained that this was a form of fly tipping and people could be prosecuted for doing this. Cllr Smith asked why it took SDDC 3 weeks to collect a fridge off the pavement on Hawthorn Crescent after being reported, which had actually been there for at least 6 weeks. Cllr Ford replied that they won't collect anything that collection has not been paid for in the correct way.
- He reported that the blocked drains around the Village Green had been reported and he had requested an update on the drains on Main Street from Severn Trent.
- It had been reported that the lights on the A38 roundabout were not working.
- Etwall Children's Centre would be closing at the end of November 2016.
- There would be a Getting to Know Meeting being held next week regarding the Willington Power Station. This meeting would not be open to members of the public.

5. Minute Number 3049/16 - To confirm the Minutes of the Monthly Findern Parish Council Meetings held on 13th October 2016.

Resolved: Findern Parish Council approved that the Minutes of the Findern Parish Council Meetings held on 8th September 2016, having been circulated were approved and signed as a true record

6. Minute Number 3050/16 - Findern Parish Room Management

Resolved: Findern Parish Council agreed for the Clerk to take this matter off the agenda for December 2016.

7. Minute Number 3051/16 - Chairman's report

The Chair read out her report as follows:

Chair's Report November 2016

Wendy Hithersage Di and Vic Wright and I have again spruced up the village planters so hopefully we should have a great show in the spring.

Richard, Suzi, Brian and myself had a very enjoyable afternoon being entertained by Toyota together with members of neighbouring Parish Councils, the chair of SDDC and our MP Heather Wheeler at Derby County's match with Sheffield Wednesday. The icing on the cake was a great win for the Rams after a string of disappointing results.

The work at the Parish Rooms to create a Tearoom is progressing well and we are on schedule for Lindsey to open before Christmas. I personally am looking forward to having a place to meet and chat with village friends over tea and cake.

8. Minute Number 3052/16 - Hillside Playing Field update – Previously reported under minute number 3026/16

The Clerk reported that she had been asked to inform Findern Parish Council that the current play equipment had now been repaired and the play area was now open for use.

9. Minute Number 3053/16 - Report of the Parish Clerk

- a) Village Pump – Previously reported under minute number 1621/15, 1638/15, 1655/15, 1683/15, 1699/15, 1716/15, 1739/15, 1757/15, 1774/15, 1894/15, 1921/16, 1937/16, 1970/16, 1995/16, 2025/16, 2097/16, 3027/16

Cllr Woodhouse reported that work will progress shortly when time is available to replace the trough and to install the paving around the pump area. Cllr Woodhouse explained that he was donating the paving to the village free of charge.

The Chair reported that she would be planting daffodil bulbs in the area sometime during the following week.

The Chair reported that the Historical Group had a plaque which would be screwed to the wall by the pump.

- b) Maypole – Previously reported under minute number 1739/15, 1757/15, 1774/15, 1894/15, 1921/16, 1937/16, 1970/16, 1995/16, 2025/16, 2097/16, 3027/16

Cllr Smith reported that he was awaiting a meeting with the Head Teacher at Findern Primary School to confirm that they will join in with this project. He reported that after the last meeting a place to store the maypole had been offered.

- c) Findern Primary School PTA request for a Grant – Previously reported under minute number 2097/16, 3027/16

The Clerk read out the Wish List as follows:

The Clerk explained that although the Parish Council were not allowed to give grants to other Local Authorities the Findern PTA were a Registered Charity and in that respect the Parish Council were able to give a Parish Council Grant. She explained that the PTA would be required to give her a copy of the receipts for the purchase of equipment and the money would need to be spent within 12 months.

Resolved: Findern Parish Council agreed to give a grant to cover the wish list as above to the value of £2,537.40.

Resolved: Once the equipment is in place the Parish Council would like an official ribbon cutting and plaque event to record the grant.

- d) Steps at the King George Playing Field – Previously reported under minute number 2097/16, 3027/16

Cllr Woodhouse reported that this work would be completed in November 2016.

- e) Harris Fencing near the Nadee – Previously reported under minute number 2097/16, 3027/16

The Clerk reported that Network rail had investigated the fencing and it does belong to them. At this stage they are not prepared to remove the fencing as it is protecting their property. The long term plan is for Network Rail is to install some Palisade Fencing but they do not have the money to do this at present, the Harris Fencing will stay in place until such time that this work can be completed.

Resolved: The Clerk to contact the Nadee Restaurant and update them of the situation.

- f) Residential overhanging trees and hedges – Previously reported under minute number 2097/16, 3027/16

The Chair reported that only one property had not yet cut their vegetation back to their boundary line but we would keep an eye on this.

It was reported that there was still overhanging vegetation on the path towards school.

Resolved: The Clerk to contact network rail to get this work completed.

Resolved: Findern Parish Council agreed to suspend Standing Orders to allow a member of the Public to speak.

A Member of Footpaths said that if Network Rail did not cut this back, they were happy to ask the Payback Team to complete this work.

Cllr Smith reported that the fencing was down on the Footpath from Findern to Toyota.

A member of Footpaths Group said that they would have a look at this.

Resolved: Findern Parish Council agreed to reinstate Standing Orders.

- g) Replacement Benches on the Village Green and request to relocate one – Previously reported under minute number 3027/16

Resolved: It was agreed that the new benches would be situated in their current locations as alternative locations still overlooked people's properties. People also sat on the benches to look at the Village Green and to eat their lunch.

Resolved: It was agreed that the benches would be replaced with wooden benches instead of plastic as this was within keeping of the Village Green.

Resolved: The Clerk to obtain prices for the next meeting.

- h) Repairs to the Camel Rocker – Previously reported under minute number 3027/16

Cllr Johnson reported that the parts had been ordered, he was just awaiting a date and time for the repairs to be completed.

i) Mowers – Previously reported under minute number 3027/16

Resolved: The above item was deferred until the December 2016 Parish Council Meeting.

j) Village power cuts – previously reported under minute number 3027/16

The Clerk reported that she had contacted Western Power and to be able to investigate the problem, they will require dates, times and for how long the electricity was interrupted. The Clerk urged everyone to keep a diary of the issues and to let her have a copy at the next meeting to be able to resolve this matter.

k) Carpark at the back of the Church – Previously reported under minute number 3027/16

There was nothing to report.

l) Christmas Tree

Cllr Woodhouse reported that he would be supplying and installing the Christmas Tree including the lights for the Village Green free of Charge.

Resolved: Cllr Woodhouse was given permission to purchase new lights for the Christmas Tree.

Resolved: The Parish Council thanked Cllr Woodhouse for his kind donation on behalf of the Village.

Resolved: Findern Parish Council agreed for Cllr Woodhouse to arrange the removal of the old electric post on the Village Green and a slab to be placed over the top.

m) Christmas Festival

The Chair gave her report as follows:

- This event will be going ahead on 16.12.2016, the posters are up and people are asking for tickets.
- It will be the same format as last year with carols on the Green around the Christmas Tree, followed by entertainment from Harmony Plus at Findern Village Hall.
- Volunteers were required to make mince pies for the event.

Resolved: Findern Parish Council agreed for the Chair to ask Liz Froggatt if she would like to turn on the Christmas Lights this year. If not the Chair was to ask the Vicar Rev Sue Starkey.

n) Cemetery gates and grass cutting

The Chair reported that there was a lot of concern about the state of the cemetery, the concerns were in relation to the long grass and the fact that the area is not cut or maintained very often. She reported that the current plan was to extend the cemetery into Mr Hicklin's field.

It was reported that SDDC owned the cemetery but there was talk of getting a group of volunteers together willing to help maintain it better. The Clerk replied that permission from SDDC would be required for this and they would need to be a separately constituted group.

Resolved: The Clerk to contact SDDC to ask the following:

- **Could the grass be sprayed with a grass regulator to slow down the growth and to save on the amount of cutting required? This would make the cemetery tidier over time.**
- **Could SDDC repair the gates?**
- **Would SDDC support a group of Volunteers to maintain the area or would they give financial support to the Parish Council to maintain the area.**

o) Trees on the Village Green

Resolved: The Clerk to chase Martin Buckley for a Tree Report on the King George Playing Field especially the tree by the seat.

Resolved: The Clerk to check if the small Oak Tree is covered by a Tree Protection Order on the Village Green and inform Cllr Woodhouse.

- p) Post boxes to be refurbished on the Village Green and Heath Lane

The Clerk reported that she had contacted Royal Mail by telephone and had been informed that they would not give the Parish Council permission to repaint them due to Health and Safety. She was now awaiting a response on if Royal Mail would complete the work and when after making an online enquiry.

- q) Land Registration of The Village Green and The King George V Playing Field

The Clerk reported that she had been informed that the Village Green was not registered in the name of Findern Parish Council. However on checking the status on this and the King George Playing Field with the Parish Council Solicitor. It has been established that both parcels of land are in fact registered to Findern Parish Council but were registered at previous Clerk's or Councillor's addresses. The Clerk was now in the process with the Solicitor of amending this to the Registered Office address for Findern Parish Council.

- r) Community Governance Review 2016 – Barrow upon Trent, Twyford & Stenson and Stenson Fields

The Clerk explained that the Community Governance Review was now open for comment and people could go on the SDDC website for the information.

Findern Footpaths Group Meeting
Thursday 3 November Findern Methodist Chapel

FPG have been in touch with the Canal & River Trust (C&RT) re. who will be their contact following changes to their management structure

The 6 existing .hand propelled mowers (no longer fit for purpose) will be scrapped and the Parish Council will source 2 replacement mowers ready for 2017 mowing season.

The payback team put in 66 hours unpaid work during October.

As the Footpaths are now a smaller group, the delivery of the Parish Newsletter is becoming more of a problem and it was suggested that the village be approached for assistance. This will be discussed during the January meeting when the delivery areas will be reviewed.

Following the change of use of the Parish Rooms and as a temporary measure, FPG have been renting a garage for the storage of their documents etc. In an attempt to find something more permanent Murrays Funeral Directors were approached to see if they could help. Subsequently, Murrays have offered the use of a meeting room as well as storage space and the use of the kitchen and toilet all free of charge. Following discussion a vote was taken on whether to accept Murrays offer and a majority voted to accept it. There is some preparatory work to be done, but it is hoped that the January meeting can be held at Murrays. (There is no meeting in December)

FPG will be reviewing their constitution and a group of senior members (in experience not age) will be doing this and presenting it to the January meeting.

Fun on the Green (October 26) was enjoyed by those who attended, but numbers were down on previous years. It is likely that this will be the last such event not least because DCC will no longer be able to provide their support

FPG are now reduced in numbers and next year they will concentrate on maintaining their footpaths and wildlife sites rather than embarking on any major projects.

On 27 January next year there will be a talk by Chris Hollis "A Year in the Woods" in the Methodist Chapel, Tickets £3.00, numbers limited to 40
